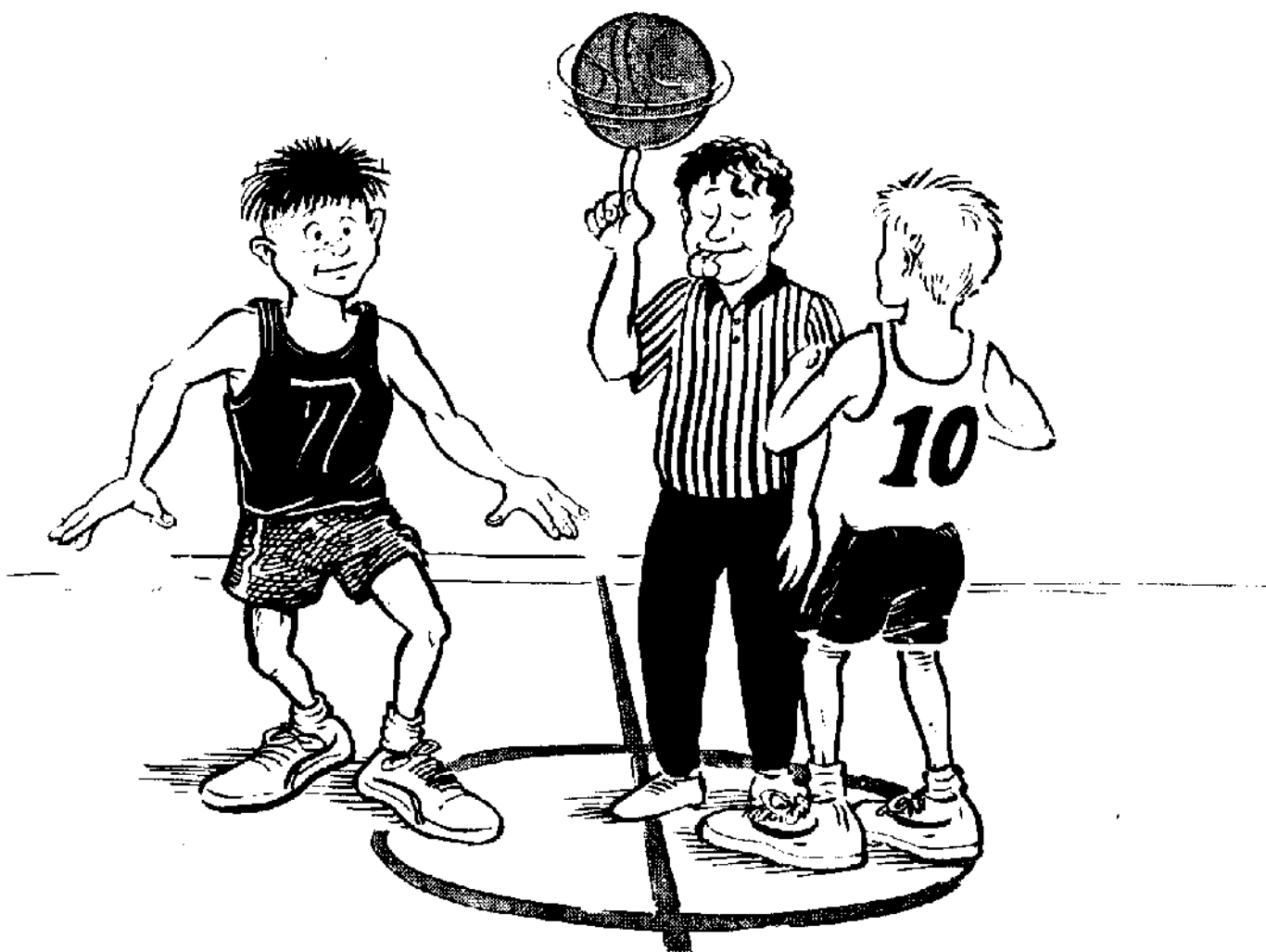


# HOW TO OPERATE A FIBA SCORESHEET

# Scoretable Booklet on how to operate the FIBA Scoresheet

This information has been compiled to assist parents to perform scoring duties required at representative level. It is extremely important that everyone knows the current timing and regulations. Scorer Officials are required to assist the Referees in the smooth running of the game. On the scorebench NO barracking or questioning of referees' decisions is allowed or reacting negatively to referees' decisions. Always conduct yourself in a professional manner and do not become involved with the bad behaviour of others.

The keys to being successful on the scorebench

- Correctness (Rule Knowledge)
- Concentration (Personal Ability)
- Communication (Professionalism)
- Co-operation (Team Work)

Without these four elements the Scoretable will not work efficiently.

The person doing the scoresheet should also act as chairperson, signalling to the referee, or acknowledging the referees' calls. The other person, should do the timing of the game, check the scorer and operate the scoreboard.

The official Scoresheet for Junior Representative Level from 2011 shall be the FIBA scoresheet.

The Victorian Championships (VC) use a four quarter FIBA scoresheet.

The VJBL, EQCBC and North West League use a two 20 minute halves FIBA scoresheet.

It is recommended that the scorer use a two or three colour pen and never finish in red.

## **POSSESSION ARROW**

The possession arrow is situated in the middle of the scorebench where the referees can see it and points in the direction of play for the team entitled to the next possession. This occurs when a jump ball situation occurs, e.g. held ball, unknown out of bounds, ball lodges between ring and backboard, start of any period including extra periods.

At the beginning of half time (the arrow will be changed in front of the Referees as teams exchange baskets for the second half).

The Possession Arrow is changed after the ball has been passed in following a Jump Ball situation or if the team with possession draws a violation before passing the ball in. If a foul is called before the ball is inbounded the Possession Arrow does NOT change.

**THE SCORER** - will complete the official FIBA Scoresheet.

The Scorer is responsible for:-

- Recording all successful baskets scored and calling the score (of the scoring team only) to the Visuals Operator.
- Recording all Personal Fouls and Team Fouls and calling these to the Visuals Operator e.g. 3rd personal, 2nd team.
- Immediately informing the Referee if a player has committed their 5th Personal Foul or 2nd Unsportsmanlike Foul

- Recording Coach (and/or Bench) fouls and informing the Referee when the Coach has reached two fouls of his own or three accumulated from his bench
- Recording all Time Outs used in each half for each team and informing the Referee when a Coach has used all Time Outs available

### PRE GAME

The rules of the game require each team to fill in the scoresheet at least 10 minutes before the beginning of the game. The team managers of each team shall obtain the relevant scoresheet

- First named Team or the Home team is the “A” team.
- Second Named Team is the “B” team.
- Fill in Date, Time, Court Grade and sex.
- Fill in names of Teams, and each player’s name and number – **in numerical order**. Record each player’s surname in upper case and first name in lower case.
- Fill in the Coach’s name – and that of the assistant coach (if applicable)

### SCORING

The FIBA scoresheet has four columns to record the running score. In each A B group of four columns the two columns on the left are for team “A” and two columns on the right are for team “B”. In the centre columns are the running score to a maximum of 160 points for each team.

Write the number of the player who scored next to the running total for the team.

To mark the RUNNING SCORE columns use the following :-

✓ A diagonal line is drawn over the score for successful field goals, 2points

Any missed shots or free throws are NOT recorded.

✓ A diagonal line for successful 3 point shots & circle the player’s number, In this case circle the number 7

● A dot is drawn over the score for any successful free throws.

In this RUNNING SCORE group of columns shows that the following points have been scored

- 2 points to # 6 team A
- 3 points to # 7 team A
- 1 point to # 8 team A
- 2 points to #4 team A
- 2 points to #6 team A
- 2 points to #8 team A

- 1 point to # 6 team B
- 2 points to # 6 team B
- 2 points to # 5 team B
- 2 points to # 9 team B
- 2 points to # 8 team B
